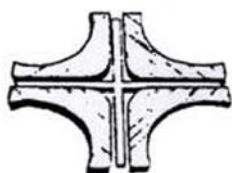

Book Club

An American woman goes behind the veil, **Kabul Beauty School**, by Deborah Rodriguez, is our Book Club read for February 9.

Soon after the fall of the Taliban, in 2001, Deborah Rodriguez went to Afghanistan as part of a group offering humanitarian aid to the war-torn nation. Surrounded by men and women whose skills – as doctors, nurses, and therapists – seemed eminently more practical than her own, Rodriguez, a hairdresser and mother to two from Michigan, despaired of being of any real use. Yet she soon found she had a gift for befriending Afghans, and once her profession became known she was eagerly sought out by Westerners desperate for a good haircut and by Afghan women, who have a long and proud tradition of running their own beauty salons. Thus an idea was born.

With the help of corporate and international sponsors, the Kabul Beauty School welcomed its first class in 2003. Well meaning but sometimes brazen, Rodriguez stumbled through language barriers, overstepped cultural customs, and constantly juggled the challenges of a postwar nation even as she learned how to empower her students to become their families' breadwinners by learning the fundamentals of coloring techniques, haircutting, and makeup.

Yet within the small haven of the beauty school, the line between teacher and student quickly blurred as these vibrant women shared with Rodriguez their stories and their hearts: the newlywed who faked her virginity on her wedding night, the twelve-year-old bride sold into marriage to pay her family's debts, the Taliban member's wife who pursued her training despite her husband's constant beatings. Through these and other stories, Rodriguez found the strength to leave her own unhealthy marriage and allow herself to love again, Afghan style.



With warmth and humor, Rodriguez details the lushness of a seemingly desolate region and reveals the magnificence behind the burqa. *Kabul Beauty School* is a remarkable tale of an extraordinary community of women who come together and learn the arts of perms, friendship, and freedom.

**Season of the Church Year: Lent**

Lent is a love story seen through Christ’s Passion. We ponder Jesus’ suffering, to be sure, but in that suffering we see God’s passion and great love for us, and seeing that love, our lives are changed.

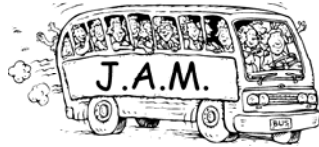

Everybody Has Something to Offer

I was recently thinking about our theme “Catching the Wave ... of God’s Dream”. One of the key messages of our work together in this area is that Gloria Dei is investing a great amount of time and energy discussing, listening, and trying to discern where God is leading us across generational ministry. How can we best serve the needs of our congregation, our community, and our world as we develop into devoted disciples of Jesus?

All of a sudden it hit me and the light went on I realized that one of the unspoken, underlying principles in this activity is really the concept that *Everybody Has Something to Offer*. A church that is committed to this concept will live, work, and act differently than a church that is committed to just do “business-as-usual”.

Last year, we studied the book of Acts together, and discussed the idea of becoming *ACTion Christians*. It might be helpful, as we consider the new year that God is inviting us into, to remind ourselves of the way the church operated in the “early” days. The book of Acts begins with the disciples being given a vision of the good news about Jesus reaching the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). They didn’t have any charts, goals, objectives, or Powerpoint presentations. But they did create the most successful movement in history: the Christian Church.

It seems that there were several behaviors that helped them become successful. First of all, they prayed all the time (Acts 1:14). Just like the early church, we need to make sure that we include God in the conversation. Let’s face it, if God isn’t in it, it won’t work anyway. (In February, some of our worship messages will be focused on how you can keep God engaged in the conversations of your daily life through prayer.)

Second, the early Christians never hesitated to do what they thought God was calling them to do (no matter how scary or

how hard). As a response to the principle that Everybody Has Something to Offer, we should expect people to *take ACTION* out of their sense of call and enthusiasm for the mission of God’s church.

Third, Jesus’ first followers often got it wrong. They found themselves, again and again, faced with situations they hadn’t expected and weren’t quite sure how to handle. (Acts 8:39-40). If, in our church, everyone has been set free and is actively making stuff happen, we know that we will experience occasional bouts of chaos, too. We should be prepared to be surprised! Sometimes we’re going to take a wrong turn. Sometimes we will discover that God is calling us into an entirely different direction. Once in a while, we might even have a big mess on our hands.

But lastly, we will move forward, anyway, full of hope, knowing that all things will come together for good when we are putting our trust in God. Those early Christians knew: This is God’s church. It was God’s in the beginning. And God always finished what he starts. We will need to trust that this is true. (Acts 27:25)

We ought to know, down in our Lutheran souls, that when any one of us walks into a room, Jesus really *is* there. God is at work in every single one of us. **Everybody has something to offer!**
