## Book Club

Gifted with “a remarkable ability to make us share her characters’ feelings” (people), Jodi Picoult now explores the complex choices of the heart for a young Amish woman and the compelling journey of discovery for an urban lawyer who befriends and protects her.

**PLAIN TRUTH** is the Book Club read for **March 9**.



The small town of Paradise, PA, is a jewel in Lancaster County – known for its picture-postcard landscapes and bucolic lifestyle. But that peace is shattered by the discovery of a dead infant in the barn of an Amish farmer. A police investigation quickly leads to two startling disclosures: the newborn’s mother is an unmarried Amish woman, eighteen-year-old Katie Fisher and the infant did not die of natural causes.

One hundred miles away, Philadelphia defense attorney Ellie Hathaway has achieved an enviable, high profile career. Fate brings her to Katie Fisher. Suddenly, Ellie sees the chance to defend a client who truly needs her, not just one who can afford her. But taking on this case challenges Ellie in more ways than one. She finds herself not only in a clash of wills with a client who does not want to be defended but also in a clash of cultures with a people whose channels of justice are markedly different from her own.

## March is MN FoodShare Month

Gloria Dei is participating in the Minnesota Food Share Campaign during the month of March. All food and cash donations will go to Channel One to help re-stock their Food Shelf. In 2009, Channel One Food Shelf provided free supplemental food to an average of 3,500 household visits each month, making food available to over 9,000 individuals on a monthly basis. The Food Shelf distributed more than 2.88 million pounds of food. Hunger continues to be a choice we do not want people to have to make in Olmsted County. Almost three-quarters of the people using the food shelf, hold at least one job.

During the month of March, Channel One barrels will be placed in the narthex and near the west entrance for your food donations. In addition, Minnesota Food Share offering envelopes will be provided in the narthex for cash donations. All checks should be made out to Gloria Dei and the envelopes can be dropped in the offering plate or sent to the church office.

Although we welcome donations of either food or cash, we encourage you to make cash donations whenever possible. With a cash donation, Channel One can buy food items at a very low cost, thus providing more food for the dollar.

### Another Way to Support MN FoodShare Month!

Gloria Dei is a huge supporter of our local food bank, Channel One. The Sustenance Committee is offering for sale a cookbook, "The Aries to Ziemer Family Cookbook" written by Gloria Dei member, Deb Aries. The book was written in gratitude for the help her family received a number of years ago from a food bank. All proceeds will be given to Channel One. The cookbook may be purchased for a donation of \$15 from Carol Fisher in the church office or directly from Deb Aries (252-8743).

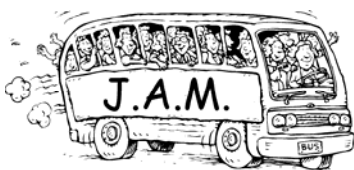

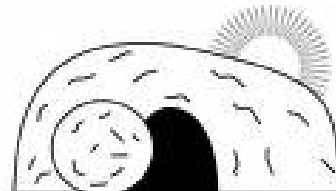

Catching the Wave of God's Dream  
March 2010 Update

## “Catching the Wave of God’s Dream”

*A monthly review of how God is leading the ministry of Gloria Dei*

God is doing great things at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church. God works through the people, the leaders, the plans and the programs. But it is God who makes all this happen. As we make new plans for ministry, we first look to what God is doing and then

join him. Like a surfer looking for that powerful wave that will carry him to shore, so we look to what God is doing. We do two things: we evaluate which wave to get on board and then we evaluate our test-ride to see if this was really what God wanted

us to do. Each month, we will give you an update of the waves that our leadership has chosen to test-ride and an evaluation of how these test-rides are coming along.

### Generational Ministry Wave

**What is it?**

This wave involves two things. First, it acknowledges our unity within diversity. As a congregation, we are united in our mission of making “fully devoted disciples.” We have identified six areas of discipleship: prayer and Bible study (UP), Bible study and faith community/small group (IN), and mission and service (OUT). These six things unite us. But each generation approaches these six activities a little differ-

ently. Rather than fighting over doing things just one way, we bless each other. We encourage each generation to “do” ministry in the most meaningful way for that generation. We celebrate our unity within diversity. Secondly, we are developing a structure that empowers each generation to carry out its unique ministry. In business, this is called a multi-divisional structure. We call ours a multi-generational structure.

**The Test-Ride**

Is Generational Ministry a wave from God? We don’t know. So we test-ride this wave to see if there really is enough energy to carry us into a new way of doing ministry. We began our test-ride in September at our monthly Council meeting. As one might expect, the details of such a structural change are immense. By the end of this year, we should have a better sense of our test-ride of this wave.

### Generational Worship Wave

**What is it?**

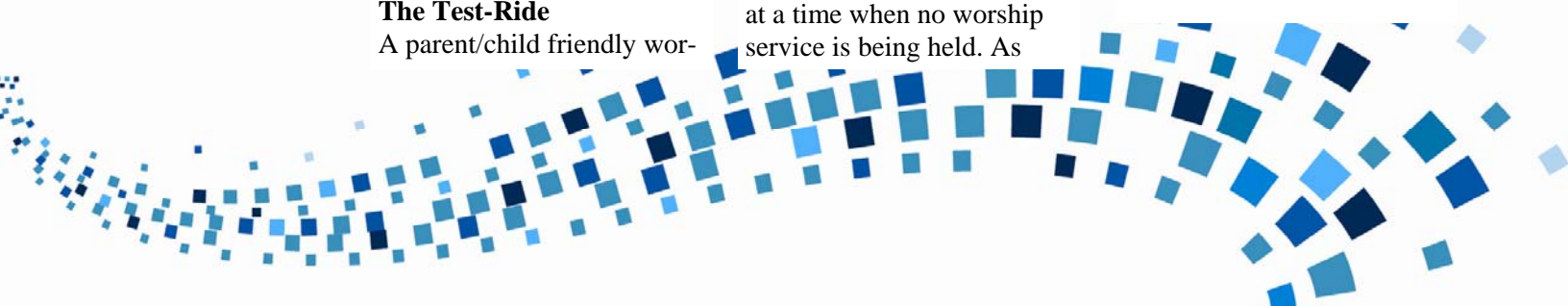
As our generational structure met last fall, worship that was meaningful to each generation seemed to be a wave that needed our attention.

**The Test-Ride**

A parent/child friendly wor-

ship service will be held for five weeks this spring (April 18 – May 16). We are test driving several things: worship which is welcoming to families with smaller children, simultaneous worship services, and Sunday School at a time when no worship service is being held. As

### Faith Community/Small Groups Wave

**What is it?**

As our generational structure met last fall, connecting to one another was another wave that needed our attention. Each generation ex-

pressed a need to connect with others, possibly through small groups.

**The Test-Ride**

At this time, the staff is con-

sidering ways to test-ride this wave. In the meantime, several groups are forming small groups or other types of faith communities.

### Capital Campaign 2010-2012 Wave

**What is it?**

Seven years ago, we took on capital debt to remodel our building and to purchase 30 acres of land in NW Rochester. We continue to have three year capital campaigns to pay off this debt. Our next campaign will be held this fall. We are considering connecting this campaign with our vision casting. If

we can cast a winsome vision for our congregation's future, the capital campaign could be a mandate from the people of our congregation regarding our optimism and confidence in God's wave.

**The Test-Ride**

The challenge for this wave will be to have time to actually test-ride any vision for

our future between now and this fall. We do not want to simply offer some plan for the future that does not have the congregation's full support. We must have congregational "buy-in" that comes from watching the test-ride and agreeing, "This is what God wants us to do."
