Book Club

Fan Shen, author of **Gang of One: Memoirs of a Red Guard**, was our guest at Book Club in October. He outlined for us how he wrote the book over a period of seven years and continued the story of his life since arriving in the United States, as that was not a part of the book. Mr. Shen, who is an English professor at Rochester Community and Technical College, lives in Rochester with his wife and daughter. In Chinese, “Fan” means ordinary, which we all agreed that he definitely is not ordinary.



For November 10 we will be discussing **The Boy From C-11**, a memoir by Harvey Ronglien, which is his story of being an orphan and growing up and living in House C-11 in Owatonna. The Minnesota State Public School for Dependent and Neglected Children housed more than ten thousand children during its sixty-year history. Harvey Ronglien shows readers a panoramic view of this institution, first through the eyes of a child, then as an adult, and finally as its most proactive and respected historian. This book takes readers into the world of American orphanages that no longer exist. He gives an honest, heart-wrenching account of his struggles to overcome his difficult childhood and his later commitment to ensure that the children of the State School will not be forgotten. People of all ages can learn from Mr. Ronglien’s stories, told in his book. He and his wife Maxine will join us on Tuesday, November 10 to discuss this amazing book.

Everyone is welcome to come and join us (you do not need a special invitation) on the second Tuesday of the month at 2:00 p.m. (September – May) in the Fireside Room, as we discuss books and enjoy fellowship with one another. 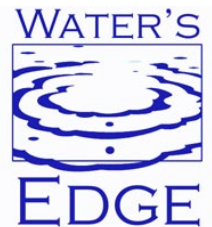

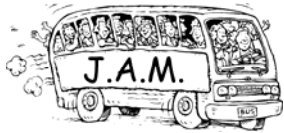


Prayer Table

I really hate being late. But, even as I write this month's newsletter, I'm reminded that I am once again late for Kristin's deadline for submitting this newsletter article. With the frenetic pace that each of our world's run at, and all the electronic energy distracting our attention (e-mail, cell phones, TVs, twitters and tweets, Facebook, etc.), wouldn't it be nice to be on time? At least occasionally? Wouldn't it be a relief to slow down a bit? Wouldn't it be great if life were a little less of a blur? To enjoy the ride of life as much as the "leaf-peepers" (as I call them) enjoy the Fall foliage of the Mississippi River Bluffs between Wabasha and Winona.



We all have our coping mechanisms. For example, the clock in my car is set five minutes ahead, so as I'm chauffeuring our kids or myself to a meeting that I think I'm going to be late to, I'm inadvertently surprised by getting there on time.

So, what's all this got to do with Stewardship?
